





RULES OF PROCEDURE, CONDUCT, AND DECORUM AT MEETINGS OF THE MILAM COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' COURT

- IV. The business of Milam County is conducted by and between the members of the Milam County Commissioners Court and by those members of the county staff, elected officials, department heads, consultants, experts and/or members of the public requested to be present and participate. While the public is invited to attend all meetings of the Commissioners Court (except Executive Sessions) the public's participation therein is limited to that of observers unless a member (or members) of the public is requested to address the Commissioners Court on a particular issue or (issues) or unless the member (or members) of the public completes a Public Participation Form and submits same to the County Judge's Secretary or county clerk prior to the time the Court Session is called to order. A sample of the Milam County Commissioners Court Public Participation Form is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".
- Each member of the public who appears before the Commissioners Court shall be limited to a maximum of five (5) minutes to make his/her remarks. Time for each speaker shall be maintained by the County Clerk or such other designated representative of the Commissioners Court.
 - Maximum discussion on any agenda item, regardless of the number of members of the public wishing to address the Commissioners Court on such agenda item (or items) shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes. In the event that more than six (6) members of the public wish to address a particular agenda item (or items), then only the first six (6) members of the public recognized to speak shall be divided equally between those members of the public wishing to speak for the agenda item (or items) and those members of the public wishing to speak against the agenda item (or items).
 - In matters of exceptional interest, the Court may, by the majority vote of the members of the Court in attendance at the meeting, either shorten or lengthen the time allocated for a particular member of the public, all members of the public and/or the amount of time allocated for all agenda items and/or a specific agenda item.
 - It is the intention of the Court to provide an open access to the citizens of Milam County to address the Commissioners Court and to express themselves on issues of county government. Members of the public are reminded that the Milam County Commissioners Court is a Constitutional Court, the Milam County Commissioners Court also possesses the power to issue a Contempt of Court Citation under Section 81.024 of the Texas Local Government Code. Accordingly, all members of the public in attendance at any Regular, Special and/or Emergency meeting of the Court shall conduct themselves with proper respect and decorum in speaking to, and/or addressing the Court; in participating in public discussions before the Court; and in all actions in the presence of the Court. Proper attire for men, women and children is mandatory. Those members of the public who are inappropriately attired and/or who do not conduct themselves in an orderly and appropriate manner will be ordered to leave the meeting. Refusal to abide by the Court's order and/or continued disruption of the meeting may result in a Contempt of Court Citation.
 - It is not the intention of the Milam County Commissioners Court to provide a public forum for the demeaning of any individual or group. Neither is it the intention of the Court to allow a member (or members) of the public to insult the honesty and/or integrity of the Court, as a body, or any member (or members) of the Court, individually or collectively. Accordingly, profane, insulting or threatening language directed toward the Court and/or any person in the Court's presence and/or racial, ethnic, or gender slurs or epithets will not be tolerated. Violation of these rules may result in the following sanctions:
 - Cancellation of a speaker's remaining time;
 - Removal from the Commissioners Courtroom;
 - A Contempt Citation; and/or
 - Such other civil and/or criminal sanctions as may be authorized under the Constitution, Statutes and Codes of the State of Texas.

INTER-GOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

CITY OF BUCKHOLTS AND MILAM COUNTY

**ORDER OF ACCEPTANCE OF DEDICATION

WHEREAS, the above an foregoing Dedication of Public Interest in Road or Right-of-Way, having been duly presented to the Commissioners' Court of Milam County, Texas; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court of Milam County, Texas, acting in its official function as established by Article V, Section 18 of the Texas Constitution, and Chapters 251 and 281 of the Texas Transportation Code, hereby determines and makes a specific finding that the dedication of a public interest in a road or right-of-way in the location described in the dedication at issue, will serve a public purpose and will benefit the people of Milam County, Texas, and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court, having considered the nature and type of use the proposed road or right-of-way is expected to experience, has required prior to the acceptance documents by this Order that a road upon the right-of-way subject to this Order be constructed to minimum standards determined by the Court to be appropriate prior to acceptance:



WHEREAS, the Court, having voted to approve the resolution,

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED BY THE MILAM COUNTY COMMISSIONERS COURT:

The **Milam County Commissioners Court** commit to the following:

- Assist in accelerating the land treatment program in the watershed
- Encourage landowners and operators within the watershed to adopt and carry out soil and water conservation plans with emphasis on those practices which will reduce floodwater and sediment damage
- Assist in periodic inspections of land treatment measures to determine maintenance needs and encourage performance of maintenance of such measures
- Participate, to the extent authorized by law, with the Local Sponsoring Organization in the maintenance of the floodwater retarding structures.

RESOLUTION OPPOSING EXPANSION of EPA'S AUTHORITY UNDER the CLEAN WATER ACT

WHEREAS, the United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) and the United States Army Corp of Engineers (USACE) have proposed a new rule to define "waters of the United States" that will vastly expand the jurisdictional authority of the federal Clean Water Act (CWA), entitled "Definition of "Waters of the United States" Under the Clean Water Act

WHEREAS, USEPA and USACE have chosen to selectively interpret various Supreme Court decisions related to the jurisdictional authority of the Clean Water Act (CWA) in order to develop a new Guidance which expands their own jurisdictional authority under the CWA to include waters of the state(s) and other waters previously not regulated under either the CWA or judicial proclamation, including some ditches, farm ponds, dry water ways and isolated wetlands;

WHEREAS, the proposed rule, if adopted will infringe upon the sovereignty of state(s) to appropriately regulate waters of the state(s);

WHEREAS, the proposed rule, if adopted would require Counties and special districts to obtain costly and burdensome Section 404 permits from the USACE for the construction of small bridges and culverts, and routine maintenance of some ditches, canals and other such water conveyances;

WHEREAS, the proposed rule, if adopted would infringe on private property rights, impairing land management activities such as urban development and agriculture production;

WHEREAS, legislation to expand the jurisdictional authority of the CWA as described in the proposed rule has failed in the U.S. Senate; and

WHEREAS, the USEPA and USACE have been criticized by both the U.S. Senate and the U.S. House of Representatives for enacting expansive rules without congressional oversight;

BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED THAT MILAM COUNTY strongly opposes the proposed new rule to define "waters of the United States" in that it increases the need for burdensome and costly permitting requirements, infringes on private property rights and circumvents the legislative process, thus, the will of the people.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT Congress, not federal agencies, make the laws and therefore any such change in jurisdictional power of the federal government should only occur as a result of the passage of federal legislation.
