RULES OF PROCEDURE, CONDUCT, AND DECORUM AT MEETINGS OF THE MILAM COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' COURT

- IV. The business of Milam County is conducted by and between the members of the Milam County Commissioners Court and by those members of the county staff, elected officials, department heads, consultants, experts and/or members of the public requested to be present and participate. While the public is invited to attend all meetings of the Commissioners Court (except Executive Sessions) the public's participation therein is limited to that of observers unless a member (or members) of the public is requested to address the Commissioners Court on a particular issue or (issues) or unless the member (or members) of the public completes a Public Participation Form and submits same to the County Judge's Secretary or county clerk prior to the time the Court Session is called to order. A sample of the Milam County Commissioners Court Public Participation Form is attached hereto as Exhibit "A".
- Each member of the public who appears before the Commissioners Court shall be limited to a maximum of five (5) minutes to make his/her remarks. Time for each speaker shall be maintained by the County Clerk or such other designated representative of the Commissioners Court.
 - Maximum discussion on any agenda item, regardless of the number of members of the public wishing to address the Commissioners Court on such agenda item (or items) shall be limited to thirty (30) minutes. In the event that more than six (6) members of the public wish to address a particular agenda item (or items), then only the first six (6) members of the public recognized to speak shall be divided equally between those members of the public wishing to speak for the agenda item (or items) and those members of the public wishing to speak against the agenda item (or items).
 - In matters of exceptional interest, the Court may, by the majority vote of the members of the Court in attendance at the meeting, either shorten or lengthen the time allocated for a particular member of the public, all members of the public and/or the amount of time allocated for all agenda items and/or a specific agenda item.
 - It is the intention of the Court to provide an open access to the citizens of Milam County to address the Commissioners Court and to express themselves on issues of county government. Members of the public are reminded that the Milam County Commissioners Court is a Constitutional Court, the Milam County Commissioners Court also possesses the power to issue a Contempt of Court Citation under Section 81.024 of the Texas Local Government Code. Accordingly, all members of the public in attendance at any Regular, Special and/or Emergency meeting of the Court shall conduct themselves with proper respect and decorum in speaking to, and/or addressing the Court; in participating in public discussions before the Court; and in all actions in the presence of the Court. Proper attire for men, women and children is mandatory. Those members of the public who are inappropriately attired and/or who do not conduct themselves in an orderly and appropriate manner will be ordered to leave the meeting. Refusal to abide by the Court's order and/or continued disruption of the meeting may result in a Contempt of Court Citation.
 - It is not the intention of the Milam County Commissioners Court to provide a public forum for the demeaning of any individual or group. Neither is it the intention of the Court to allow a member (or members) of the public to insult the honesty and/or integrity of the Court, as a body, or any member (or members) of the Court, individually or collectively. Accordingly, profane, insulting or threatening language directed toward the Court and/or any person in the Court's presence and/or racial, ethnic, or gender slurs or epithets will not be tolerated. Violation of these rules may result in the following sanctions:
 - Cancellation of a speaker's remaining time;
 - Removal from the Commissioners Courtroom;
 - A Contempt Citation; and/or
 - Such other civil and/or criminal sanctions as may be authorized under the Constitution, Statutes and Codes of the State of Texas.

Commissioner's Court Proclamation

On this 22nd day of August, 2016, the Commissioner's Court is honored to recognize Officers Michael Moehling and Kurt Kraemer of the Thorndale Police Department for their exemplary performance when on the evening of July 13th their quick life saving actions resulted in the saving of the life of a local citizen.

On Wednesday evening, July 13th at approximately 10:00 p.m., Police Officers Michael Moehling and Kurt Kraemer were at a business at the intersection of US Highway 79 and North First Street. A local resident was being driven to the hospital by his wife. The resident was reportedly feeling ill, having chest pains and believing he could be having a heart attack. As he and his wife were travelling through Thorndale they noticed the police officers at the local business. The wife turned into the parking lot and the husband contacted the officers. The man explained his medical situation and requested they call an ambulance for him. As they were requesting the ambulance, the man's heart stopped and went into cardiac arrest. The two officers quickly pulled the man from the car and began life saving measures. They applied an Automatic External Defibrillator (AED) and provided Cardio Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR). The officers revived him and were able to return his heart to a normal rhythm. Upon the arrival of the ambulance, the man was conscious and oriented. He was transported to the hospital and has since been released with a full recovery.

Congratulations on behalf of all the citizens of Milam County. We want to tell you we're proud of what you have done. You are true professionals and exceptional officers.



- Approve Standards and Codes for bridges for Milam County

Off-System Bridge Replacement and Rehabilitation Projects

Design Values

Design values selected for a particular project should satisfy and preferably exceed the values shown below. Selected design values should be consistent and compatible with the prevalent design features on the existing off-system roadway. If the route has the potential for significant ADT increases in the near future, or if the character of the traffic is not local, design requirements for the appropriate class of highway should be used.

- Minimum Design Speed: Meet or improve conditions that are typical on the remainder of the roadway.
- Vertical Curvature, Minimum K values: Meet or improve conditions that are typical on the remainder of the roadway.
- Horizontal Curvature: Meet or improve conditions that are typical on the remainder of the roadway.
- Minimum Super elevation: Meet or improve conditions that are typical on the remainder of the roadway.
- Maximum Grades: Meet or improve conditions that are typical on the remainder of the roadway.
- Minimum Structure Width, Face to Face of Rail: 24 ft [7.2 m].
- Bridge End Guard Fence:
 - Minimum Conditions – Transition section plus end treatment.
 - If an intervening roadway or driveway prevents usual placement of guard fence, a guard fence radius may be used provided the approach represents a low speed condition.
- Approach Roadway:
 - For minimum length of 50 feet [15 m] adjacent to the bridge end, the roadway crown should match clear width across structure (24 feet [7.2 m]) plus additional width to accommodate approach guard fence.
 - An appropriate transition (minimum length 50 feet [15 m]) to county road width should be made in the sections of approach roadway located at the federal project extremities.
 - If roadway surfacing is included, a minimum of 20 feet [6 m] surfacing width should be used for the 50 feet [15 m] roadway section adjacent to the bridge.
- Traffic Control:
 - When provided, and to the extent practical, detours should match existing county road design features. Design details for detours should be shown in the plans and on the preliminary layouts.

Traffic control devices should be in conformance with the *Texas Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices*, and details should be included in the plans. A typical bridge project would contain 15 - 20 of these standards sheets depending on bridge type and width.
